RESIDENCY RECLASSIFICATION FOR TUITION PURPOSES

Attention: You must be classified as a Florida resident for tuition purposes before the first day of the term you are planning to attend. Every applicant for admission to Seminole Community College is required to make a statement as to his or her length of residence in the state. The student must establish his/her presence or the presence of his/her parent currently in the state and has been for the previous 12 months. The student's resident status must be for the purpose of maintaining a bona fide domicile, rather than for the purpose of maintaining a mere temporary residence or abode prior to enrollment at Seminole Community College.

To qualify as a Florida resident for tuition purposes the student must be a U.S. citizen, permanent resident alien or a legal alien granted indefinite stay by the Immigration and Naturalization Service and who has maintained legal residence in Florida for at least 12 months. Legal residence in Florida is established when certain legal ties to the state are made. Therefore, the student must provide evidence, which satisfactorily proves that the student (his/her claimant) meets the legal requirements to qualify as a Florida resident for tuition purposes.

Living or attending school in Florida will not, in itself, establish residency. Students who depend upon out-of-state parents for support are presumed to be legal residents of the same state as their parents. The Florida Statute on residency, FS 240.1201, classifies a student as a dependent or independent student based on United States Internal Revenue Service Income Tax Codes.

Dependent: a person for whom 50 percent or more of his/her support is provided by the claimant.
Independent: a person who provides more than 50 percent of his/her own support.

- If the student is claimed as a dependent on a tax return other than their own, they will not be classified as an independent student.
- Documents supporting the establishment of legal residence must be dated, issued or filed 12 months before the first day of the term for which a Florida resident reclassification is sought.
- No single document shall be conclusive. A minimum of two documents is required.

Osbourn offers academic and career and technical curricula.

Advanced Placement and Honors courses provide differentiated curricula and teaching strategies that integrate critical thinking, creativity, research, and problem-solving skills in the content area.

Students with special needs receive instruction in a variety of settings including mainstream, inclusion, and self-contained based on individual needs. Students with limited English proficiency are enrolled in the English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) program.

In addition, through the general education, business, and career and technical programs, students may prepare to enter employment immediately upon graduation from high school.

PROFILE OF 2008 GRADUATES



RESIDENCY RECLASSIFICATION FOR TUITION PURPOSES

Attention: You must be classified as a Florida Resident for Tuition Purposes before the first day of the term you are planning to attend.

Every applicant for admission to Seminole Community College is required to make a statement as to his or her length of residence in the state. The student must establish his/her presence or the presence of his or her parent is currently in the state and has been for the previous 12-months. The student's resident status must be for the purpose of maintaining a bona fide domicile, rather than for the purpose of maintaining a mere temporary residence or abode prior to enrollment at Seminole Community College.

To qualify as a Florida resident for tuition purposes the student must be a U.S. citizen, permanent resident alien, or a legal alien granted indefinite stay by the Immigration and Naturalization Service, who has maintained legal residence in Florida for at least twelve months. **Legal residence in Florida is established when certain legal ties to the state are made.** Therefore, the student must provide evidence, which satisfactorily proves that the student (his/her claimant) meet the legal requirements to qualify as a Florida resident for tuition purposes.

Living or attending school in Florida will not, in itself, establish residency. Students who depend upon out-of-state parents for support are presumed to be legal residents of the same state as their parents. The Florida Statute on residency, FS 240.1201, classifies a student as a dependent or independent student based on United States Internal Revenue Service Income Tax Codes.

Dependent: a person for whom 50% or more of his/her support is provided by the claimant.
Independent: a person who provides more than 50% of his/her own support.

- If the student is claimed as a dependent on a tax return other than their own, they will not be classified as an independent student.
- Documents supporting the establishment of legal residence must be dated, issued, or filed 12 months before the first day of the term for which a Florida resident reclassification is sought.
- No single document shall be conclusive. A minimum of two documents is required.
- Faxed documents are not acceptable.

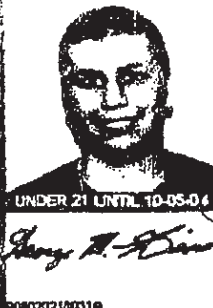
